F A C T S

- Each minute approximately 1 acre of trees is being destroyed
- A single tree produces around 260 pounds of oxygen in one year
- One acre of trees removes 2.6 tons of CO₂ per year, thus helping to reduce the "greenhouse effect" by absorbing the CO₂
- One mature tree can absorb carbon dioxide at a rate of 48 lbs./year and create enough oxygen to support 2 human beings.
